ODFW Fishing Report (as of Jan 30)

- Catchable trout were recently released at Walter Wirth Lake (1,850) and Walling Pond (450). Trout stocking at Sheridan Pond, Junction City Pond, Walling Pond, Huddleston Pond, Mt. Hood Pond, EE Wilson Pond and Walter Wirth Lake. In total, more than 5,000 trout were released.
- Detroit Reservoir is a great winter fishing destination. Trout and kokanee continue to bite during the cold weather, and there's no line at the boat ramp.
- Trout fishing on the upper Willamette between Albany and Harrisburg can be very good this time of year, when flows cooperate.
- Both boat and bank fishing have been picking up in the lower Clackamas and anglers are catching some fish.
- Winter steelhead fishing on the Sandy remains fair. Anglers have been catching winter steelhead on the Sandy, both upstream and downstream of its confluence with Cedar Creek.
- Catch-and-release sturgeon fishing is a good option on the lower
 Willamette and can be productive this time of year.
- Winter steelhead fishing is in peak season on the north coast. Rivers should be in good shape for the coming weekend.
- The best bets for winter steelhead on the mid-coast continue to be the Alsea and Siletz.
- Surplus hatchery steelhead have been released into Town Lake,
 Coffenbury Lake and Vernonia Pond. These fish brighten back up and get fairly active once in the lakes.

TREAD Lightly! Promoting responsible recreation through stewardship, education and communication.

TREAD Principle Focus:

TRAVEL RESPONSIBLY

Travel responsibly on land by staying on designated roads, trails or areas. On water, stay on designated waterways and launch watercraft in designated areas.

- Travel only in areas open to your type of watercraft or on routes open to your mode of transportation.
- Carry a Coast Guard approved life vest (PFD) that is wearable and comfortable for each person.
- Always maintain your watercraft at a manageable speed.
- Keep an eye out for other boaters, objects and swimmers.
- Do not create new routes on roads and trails or expand existing trails. Go over obstacles, not around, to avoid widening trails.
- Comply with all signs and respect barriers.
- Buddy up with two or three anglers, reducing vulnerability if you have an accident or breakdown.
- Choose access to fishing spots wisely. Be mindful of damaging fragile vegetation and soils along shorelines and stream banks.

Boat Ramp Ettiquette

Help everyone avoid ramp rage and follow these simple rules:

Prepare Before You Back- Put as much of your gear in your boat as possible before you get to the ramp. Lots of areas have staging zones well before the ramp. Even if they don't, you can get ready in the back of the parking lot. Nobody likes waiting 15 minutes while you setup a flag, look for the whistle you need and worst of all tie all your lures on while on the ramp. Don't do that! Most of us can't do everything before the offload but the less time you take the better.

Don't Be a Ramp Hog- This isn't parking at Home Depot. Learn how to back by practicing in your driveway so you are ready to ace the back in when the time comes. Once you get down there, move quickly. This is not the time for a leisurely morning stroll. Showing that you're making an effort to hurry makes a huge difference to those waiting.

Lights Off- When you do finish backing, turn your headlights off. If possible, do it on the way down. My general rule is if you are in reverse, kill the headlights.

Move to the Side- If you are flying solo and need to go park the truck, you need to find a good place to stash the boat while doing so. Off to the side is good. Still on the ramp is not. Use an anchor, brush clip or rope to secure your boat off the ramp and go park.

Quick Strap When You Load Up- Remember that staging area away from the ramp? It hasn't moved. When you come in for the day, get your boat secured just enough to get you to the top of the hill and to the staging area. At that point you can batten down the hatches for the ride home. Don't spend tons of time on the ramp securing Fort Knox.

Help a Brother Out- If you happen to be at the ramp at the same time as another fisherman, make sure and ask if they'd like help loading or unloading. It can speed things up for both of you in lots of cases. You'll be a good ambassador for the sport and might make a new fishing buddy.

If You're Going to Chat- If you are a chatty Cathy at the boat ramp, at least chat while loading/unloading. If you stop to have a conversation on the ramp, someone else may have a conversation with you too and those convos are usually not pleasant. At least make progress while exercising that gift of gab.
